1 Large Shopping Facilities

4 Tower View-dori St.

5 Sumida Triphony Hall

TRIVIA OF KINSHICHO

a. A Snack Town

Long ago, the area north of Kinshicho station was home to many confectionery wholesalers, but only a few remain today. The penny candy stores are especially beloved by children. Japanese penny candies also make ideal souvenirs.



c. Hokusai-dori St.

This street was named after Katsushika Hokusai because it is said that he was born in this area. It connects the Kinshicho and Ryogoku areas. Power lines and other utilities are run underground, which facilitates walking with ease.



b. Sumida City Loop Line Bus ("Sumimaru-Kun" and "Sumirin-Chan")

¥100 per ride. One-day hop-on hop-off passes are also available for ¥300. (Ask the driver for it when you get onboard.) It's convenient for accessing The Sumida Hokusai Museum and The Japanese Sword Museum in the Ryogoku area.



d. The World Home-Run King

Having hit 868 home runs in his professional career, Sadaharu Oh (aka Wang Chen-Chih) who is famous for his leg-kick style, became the world home-run champion. A tribute corner was set up in his honor in The Sumida City Gymnasium; as he is an honorary citizen of Sumida City. This attraction is recommended for baseball fans.
